General Advice for Job Searching

- Personal connections get you jobs more than resumes do so network!
- Carry out informational interviews with people who have or supervise jobs you're interested in. Ask them about their career path and what advice or opportunities they might have for someone at your stage. Don't be intimidated by their seniority – people love to talk about themselves!
- To prioritize your networking and job applications, make lists of 1) organizations and agencies you like and 2) locations where you want to be. Contact a scientist/practitioner in each organization/agency and carry out an informational interview to learn about the group and upcoming opportunities.
- If you do submit an application, strengthen your application by contacting someone in the organization to make a personal connection so they might vouch for you. Remember that other applicants are doing this and you'll be at a disadvantage if you don't.
- Consider volunteering or interning with an organization even if it doesn't offer a formal program. This often leads to full-time positions.
